Text 1:

When we speak of someone as following the dictates of his conscience, making a moral decision, we are usually speaking of a puzzling relation between behaviour and its consequences. For example, a young man is captured by the enemy, who demand that he betray his fellows. If he gives in, he will be rewarded handsomely. If he does not, he may be tortured or killed. Yet he does not inform. Because he chooses torture over reward, we consider his behaviour moral, and we respect him. Even if he is a criminal shielding his accomplices, we may respect him, grudgingly.
