Earthquake is a shaking, rolling, or sudden shock of the earth's surface. There may be as many as a million earthquakes in a single year. Most of them take place beneath the surface of the sea. Few of *these* cause any damage. But earthquakes that occur near large cities cause much damage and loss of life, especially if the cities rest on soft ground. The energy released by a large earthquake may equal that of about 200 million short tons of TNT. In other words, its energy may be 10,000 times as great as that of the first atomic bomb. The strength of an earthquake is measured on a scale of numbers called Richter scale.

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Passage C:

Successful fishing requires much practice and study. A person can learn only from experience how to hook and play and tire out a fish properly. To catch a particular species of fish, an angler must study its habits-what it eats, the kinds of waters it lives in, and the water depth and temperature it prefers.

The habits of a fish influence the choice of bait, the fishing technique used, and the place chosen for fishing. For example, *rainbow trout* thrives in cool, clear streams with swift current. They often feed near the surface of the water, where the current brings them insects to eat. A favorite method of catching these fish is fly fishing with a dry fly, casting upstream. On the other hand, many kinds of catfish live in muddy lakes and streams near the bottom of the water. They find their food chiefly by smell or touch. Such fish may be caught by fishing near the bottom, using an odorous bait made of cheese, meat, or bread dough.
